



Data Release Application

The National Resident Matching Program Board of Directors frequently receives requests for information or data from participating institutions and their certification authorities, researchers, and other interested groups.

The NRMP has developed a set of Policies and Principles governing the release of NRMP data. The NRMP publishes, releases, or shares its data only when an application meets both of the following criteria:

- Use of the data will assist Match participants in making better informed decisions or inform the medical community about important aspects, trends, or advances Graduate Medical Education (GME), and
- The investigator will take all necessary steps to preserve the confidentiality of applicants, schools, and programs with regard to their ranking choices and match success.

Each data release application will be carefully evaluated based on the proposal's scientific rigor, academic merit, and process for protecting the confidentiality of match participants.

Most frequently, these types of data requests will be denied:

- Demographic information like race, gender, and age, which the NRMP does not collect. You may, however, find some information here: [AAMC's ERAS data](#)
- Individual level data, including applicant-, school-, and program-level data
- Email lists of applicants, schools, or programs
- Survey collaboration requests
